#### **BB** Uniform

The BB has had a number of different uniforms within its 123 years. Currently, at the end of this session, we reach the last time where any old BB uniform styles can be worn on official brigade business. When the original decision was made back in 2000 a six year introductory period was agreed for the change to gradually take place, so not to create an unnecessary additional expense to parents. (As normally lads grow at a fare pace in six years, and would outgrow any old uniform –As I am sure many parents will testify!)

Because of this, for want of a better word, expiry date a small contingent in the Brigade has suggested that there should now a last ditch attempt to retain all old versions of the uniform for formal occasions. Now I know many old Boys, Officers and Parents will fondly remember the old uniforms of the Brigade and yes the new uniform whilst more practical may not involve three tins of Duraglit (For the current lads that is what you use to Clean the Brass Bits!!) But despite these memories, the Brigade must move on.
